Progress Report on the Regional Young Workers' Committees

- The AEC has approved three committees, for the Montreal, 3L and Montérégie regions.

The first Union Succession Day was organized in Montreal in November 2015. It brought many young workers together for an overview of the PSAC structure, an explanation of how to take an idea before the union and reflection on the issues of interest to young workers in the various environments.
