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The Committee proceeded as follows:

1 Analysis of PSAC-Quebec and the Reserve Fund's financial statements and results for FY 2023, 2024 and 2025

The Finance Committee examined all income and expenditure transactions in the Reserve Fund and PSAC-Quebec's accounts. This allowed us to adjust accounting entries based on the actual amounts allocated. (See Appendix A)

Note that the 2023 and 2024 financial statements were audited (see separate audit report).

The 2025 audit is planned for April 2026. The results will be shared with the members as soon as possible.

2 Current year

As 2026 is still ongoing, it has not been analyzed by the Committee. The 2026 financial statements will be audited at the end of the fiscal year and presented at the next convention.

3 2027–2029 budget forecasts

Table 1 shows the revenue forecasts for the next cycle. The main source of revenue is the PSAC grant, \$222,433 per year. The Interest line is based on the surpluses held at the Caisse and an interest rate revised downward for this cycle.

The Partners revenue line is based on our agreement with Beneva, who pays a referral bonus for each insurance quote requested using our partner code.

The grey-shaded lines show revenue paid to PSAC-Quebec by PSAC and allocated for the operation of regional committees. The corresponding lines for expense forecasts are on the next page.

APPENDIX D

Resolutions Analyzed by the Committee

Title: COMPOSITION OF PSAC-QUEBEC CONVENTION COMMITTEES
Originator: UTE 10004
Language of origin: FRENCH

WHEREAS PSAC-Quebec By-Laws and Regulations do not mention the composition of convention committees; and

WHEREAS our organization's democratic process would gain from clarifying the mandate and composition of these committees:

BE IT RESOLVED THAT PSAC-Quebec adopt the following new regulation:

New regulation – CONVENTION COMMITTEES

1. At least ninety (90) calendar days prior to the opening date of a PSAC-Quebec triennial convention, the Quebec Council shall appoint such committees as are necessary to conduct the business of the convention.
2. There shall be three (3) standing committees:
 - a. By-Laws;
 - b. Finance;
 - c. General Resolutions.
3. Committees shall meet at least sixty (60) calendar days before the opening date of a PSAC-Quebec triennial convention. Committee reports shall be provided to delegates at least thirty (30) calendar days before the convention.
4. The Regional Executive Vice-President shall recommend the delegates to be assigned to each convention committee, subject to the approval of the Quebec Council.
5. The convention committees shall be constituted as follows:
 - a. the officers of the Quebec Council, except the Regional Executive Vice-President; and
 - b. two (2) delegates elected from each active area council.
6. The Regional Executive Vice-President shall have the exclusive authority to assign convention resolutions to convention committees.
7. Mandate for PSAC-Quebec conventions
 - a. Committees shall recommend to the delegates concurrence or non-concurrence in all resolutions submitted for their consideration. Unanimity, if any, shall be noted.
 - b. Committees shall not draft or submit new resolutions in their reports.
 - c. Each committee shall submit a written report.

- d. Decisions in committee shall be by majority vote; the committee chairperson shall have the deciding vote in the event of a tie.
- e. The committee may recommend that similar resolutions be merged into one. It shall draft the composite resolution.
- f. The committee may recommend concurrence in one or more similar resolutions and non-concurrence in others on the grounds that the intent is addressed in the recommended resolution.
- g. Committees may recommend separating resolutions into two or more resolutions, and shall produce the divided resolutions.
- h. In the course of its work, the committee shall not, in recommending the merger of two or more resolutions, by splitting a resolution or by rewriting a resolution, alter the substance of the resolution by either diminishing or increasing its importance. The intent or effect must remain the same as in the original resolution. For clarity and translation purposes only (in consultation with the local from which the resolution originated), the committee may reword resolutions, provided that such rewording does not diminish or increase the overall intent and spirit of the original resolution.
- i. The committee shall clearly identify all resolutions that have been combined, divided or incorporated into a composite resolution.
- j. When a resolution will affect the work of another committee, immediate contact shall be made with the committee in question.
- k. The chairperson of the committee shall present resolutions to the convention in the order of priority established by the members of their committee. The order of priority shall take into account the recognition of resolutions on which a “dissent” has been recorded.

Costing:

Expenses for the Regional Triennial Convention and pre-convention committees are assumed by PSAC National. The pre-convention Finance Committee therefore considers this resolution as being without cost.

By-laws

S-4

Title: REGULATION ON TRANSPARENCY OF PSAC-QUEBEC BODIES
Originator: UTE 10004
Language of origin: FRENCH

WHEREAS transparency is essential for a democratic organization to operate smoothly;

WHEREAS members frequently raise concerns about our organization's transparency;

WHEREAS the resolutions regarding the transparency of PSAC bodies adopted at the last convention did not eliminate obstacles to accessing PSAC-Quebec meeting minutes;

BE IT RESOLVED THAT PSAC-Quebec amend Regulation 12 to read as follows:

Regulation 12 – Transparency of PSAC-Quebec Bodies

1. PSAC-Quebec will ensure that Quebec Council meeting minutes are available on the PSAC-Quebec website and sent to each local within thirty (30) days of their adoption.
2. PSAC-Quebec will ensure that meeting minutes from all PSAC-Quebec bodies (regional committees, area councils) are available on the PSAC-Quebec website and sent to each local within forty (40) days of their adoption.
3. PSAC-Quebec will ensure that a full report of each convention is available on the PSAC-Quebec website and sent to each local within ~~ninety (90)~~ **one hundred and fifty (150)** days.
4. PSAC-Quebec will update all PSAC-Quebec directives, policies, regulations, and procedures with any changes and subsequently send updated documents to locals within no more than ~~ten (10)~~ **thirty (30)** days.
5. PSAC-Quebec will ensure that notices of **regular** meetings for all PSAC-Quebec bodies (regional committees and area councils) are available on the PSAC-Quebec website and sent to each relevant local at least fourteen (14) days before each meeting.

Costing:

The Committee anticipates potential costs for this resolution, including:

- Translation;
- Website storage capacity;
- Human resources needed for the website update;
- Training for writing minutes that maintain confidentiality.

However, the expenses for the actions provided for in this resolution fall under the national budget. The pre-convention Finance Committee therefore considers this resolution as being without cost for PSAC-Quebec.

Title: SECOND ALTERNATE VICE-PRESIDENT
Originator: QUEBEC COUNCIL
Language of origin: FRENCH

WHEREAS the union needs to prepare the next generation of leaders;

WHEREAS a good way to prepare future leaders is to engage elected leaders so that they have at least a passing knowledge of current issues in the region; and

WHEREAS a second alternate should be prepared for the functions they may be called upon to carry out:

BE IT RESOLVED THAT the second paragraph of By-Law 4, Section 1(b) be replaced by the following:

Unless otherwise elected, the Second Alternate shall only sit on the Quebec Council as an observer. Their primary role is to replace the First Alternate or the REVP in the event those positions become vacant. Should the position of Second Alternate become vacant, it is to remain so until the next Regional Triennial Convention. The Second Alternate shall sit on one of PSAC-Quebec's standing committees.

Costing

The Committee estimates the daily cost of an additional person at \$815 for in-person meetings that require travel and an overnight stay.

Title: ELECTION OF DCL REPRESENTATIVES TO

WHEREAS By-Law 6 does not provide for a DCL representative to be elected to the Political Action Committee, even if that is the current practice; and

WHEREAS By-Law 6 is quite dense:

BE IT RESOLVED THAT By-Law 6, Sections 3(l), (m), and (n) be replaced by the following:

“(l) elect the representatives of Quebec DCLs who will sit on PSAC-Quebec standing committees. These persons shall be elected by the DCL delegates with vote at the PSAC-Quebec Triennial Convention.”

Costing

For the two standing committees (Finance and OHS) that fall under the regional budget, the practice is already in place and therefore no additional cost would be incurred. Like the Education Committee, the meetings of the Political Action Committee are funded from a national budget line.
